





CROSS-COLLABORATION BETWEEN 2018 START-UPS AND ALUMNI





ABOUT THE COLLABORATION

XCLR8 Technologies is partnering with Allied World Healthcare to conduct a small scale trial in selected communities where Allied Word Healthcare operates in. In these communities, XCLR8 will be jointly delivering rehabilitation services, focusing on Upper and Lower Extremities Musculoskeletal conditions (e.g. Shoulder impingement and tendinopathies, Hip and Knee OA, PFPS).

CHALLENGES BEING SOLVED

- Access to physiotherapy services at affordable costs
- Low levels of compliance with rehabilitative exercises
- No objective and reliable data for therapists/ practitioners to assess patients' rehabilitation progress
- Providing a cost effective solution for governments to provide digital health services accessibility to remote communities

GOALS

- Enable access to physiotherapy services (no. of Patients received treatment; no. of Patients received more regular treatments)
- Improve quality of treatment (improved recovery times and quality of life; lower re-admissions; improved pain levels; improved functional levels)
- Create affordable treatment options (cost reduction per patient; outreach lower income beneficiary groups
- Establish a remote-rehab model use case is workable and scalable for hard-to-reach communities where medical facilities and trained medical staff are not readily available





ABOUT THE COLLABORATION

SDI Academy and Solve Education will do a co-roll out of their respective mobile applications for relevant target audience and markets. Solve Education! will also be conducting a pilot test for SDI Academy to assess the effectiveness and relevance of their platform for their community of migrant workers in learning English.

CHALLENGES BEING SOLVED

- Engage the migrant workers beyond the classroom and enable them to practise on the go through the use of technology
- To gamify the learning experience for the migrant workers to improve user engagement rates










